"For you have been called to live in freedom, my brothers and sisters. But don't use your freedom to satisfy your sinful nature. Instead, use your freedom to serve one another in love." (Galatians 5:13)

s we celebrate the 241st birthday of our nation let's reflect on the concept of freedom. Years ago one of our American submarines sank off the eastern coast. Divers attempted to rescue the crew. When they went down, they could hear the survivors tapping on the side of that submarine in Morse Code. They were tapping a question: "Is there any hope? Is there any hope?" And that same question is being asked today across America: "Is there any hope for America?"

### **IN MEMORIAM**


MAJ (Ret) Angel L. Carrion, USA (Aug 11, 1928 – Jun 17, 2017)
