The Dawn of a New Year

s the dawn of this new year begins, let us not forget to reflect on and appreciate the successes of MOAA and our chapter in the past year. After all, these successes have allowed us to reach this year as an active and impactful chapter. In the words of a noted author, "Without the stairs of the past, you cannot arrive at the future."

With the words above in mind, here is a recap of some of the key achievements by MOAA and the chapter during 2019:
Secured the repeal of the widows tax; ensured a 3.1 percent active duty pay raise; obtained a delay in DOD's plan to eliminate 18,000 military medical billets, and ensured no new health care access fees for currently serving and retirees, to name a few successes at the national level.

Regionally, our chapter provided scholarships, grants and donation totaling nearly \$30,000 to ROTC/JROTC cadets, JROTC units, and organizations that provide services and support to our military and civilian community, such as the Red Cross, USO, Fort Bragg Army Soldier and Family Support

Center, and the Airborne and Special Operations Museum.

We can also reflect proudly upon our continued support of Cumberland County's annual recognition of Purple Heart Recipients Program, and sponsoring youth within our community to attend educational activities at the Freedom Foundation in Valley Forge, Pa. The experience at the Freedom Foundation is designed to promote civic responsibility, patriotism, and knowledge of American history and government. Last, but not least, we can be thankful for the more than 1,200 hours of service donated by members to the USO.

The achievements listed above and others not mentioned should give us the impetus to excel again this year on the core objectives and values of MOAA and our chapter. Everything begins and ends with membership, as you, the member, are our most valuable asset. With that being said, we are currently in the renewal cycle for chapter membership. One of the criteria for earning a 5-Star Chapter award is to achieve 95% or better retention. You can contribute to clearing that hurdle by renewing your membership now.
