Remember, we will celebrate the scholarship winners at our May 8th luncheon at The


Mash House. Look for the flier on this event and come out and support the recognition of these young cadets as they receive their scholarship awards from the Chapter.

They too were there in both world wars, and in WWII more than 400,000 served in nearly all continents, oceans and seas. They are serving in Afghanistan and Iraq with women like Army 1st Lieutenants Ashley White and Jennifer Moreno who paid the ultimate price during combat, and women like Army Chief Warrant Officer 3 Lori Hill showing extraordinary courage while under fire.



IT WAS LOVELY SPEAKING TO YOU YESTERDAY. WE APPRECIATE THE CAPE FEAR MOAA'S INTEREST IN SUPPORTING OUR RETURNING SOLDIERS FROM DEPLOYMENT.
AS WE DISCUSSED EACH BATTALION (THERE ARE 7) ARE PLANNING SOME SORT OF WELCOME HOME BASKETS FOR SINGLE SOLDIERS RETURNING TO THE BARRACKS. AS THE SOLDIERS WILL BE RETURNING TO EMPTY ROOMS AND SOME TO ROOMS NOT EVEN IN THE BRIGADE FOOTPRINT, THESE BASKETS WILL BE ESSENTIAL FOR THEIR TRANSITION BACK INTO FT BRAGG.

SOME ITEMS THAT CAN BE FOUND IN THESE BASKETS INCLUDE TWIN SHEETS, TOWELS, WASHCLOTHS, TOILETRIES, LAUNDRY SOAP, LAUNDRY BASKET, SNACKS, AND WATER. TO PROVIDE A SOLDIER WITH THE EARLIER LISTED ITEMS WOULD COST ON AVERAGE, \$12.00. ALL THESE ITEMS WOULD BE THE SOLDIERS TO KEEP. OUR GOAL IS TO CREATE A SENSE OF HOME FOR ALL THESE HARDWORKING SOLDIERS WHO ARE NOT RETURNING TO THEIR HOMES BUT THE BARRACKS.
